

Colonoscopy Instructions

Please remember to read through all the pre-operative colonoscopy instructions. As it is pertinent to your upcoming procedure. If you do not follow the instructions, it could lead to your procedure being cancelled or rescheduled.

The following medications are used to prep for your procedure. Often, they are over the counter and can be purchased at your local pharmacy.

Medications

There are instances when your insurance carrier does not cover the medications we send, if you need purchase any of the items over the counter. Here is a list of what you would need to purchase.

- Dulcolax Laxative Pills
- MiraLAX (238 gram) Bottle

Preparing for your Colonoscopy-7 Days Prior

- Patient's taking blood thinning medication such as Coumadin, Warfarin, Plavix, Xarelto, Eliquis, etc,
 please obtain clearance from your prescribing physician when to stop and restart the medications. Some
 of the medications listed will require you to stop 3-5 days prior. Please call the prescribing providers
 office to obtain clarification on when it is safe to stop and restart.
- Stop all anti-inflammatory medications such as aspirin, ibuprofen, Advil, and Aleve. Fish Oil should also be discontinued. If you need anything 7 days prior, TYLENOL only.

Preparing for your Colonoscopy-1 Day Prior

- DO NOT TAKE ANY FIBER SUPPLEMENTS
- 1 Day prior to your procedure, you will begin a **clear liquid diet**. This begins as soon as you wake up. You should drink plenty of fluids.
- At 3pm, consume 3 Dulcolax Laxative Pills
- At 3pm, mix the whole bottle of MiraLAX (238grams/1 ½ cups of MiraLAX powder) with a 64oz of
 Gatorade/Powerade/ or Crystal Light for diabetic patients. Make sure the drink you chose is NOT BLUE or
 RED. Shake well and consume drink 15 ounces every 30 minutes until gone. The bottle must be
 completely empty.
- If by 8pm, your bowel movements are not completely clear:
- Continue drinking plenty of fluids. *Nothing to eat or drink after midnight*.

Clear Liquid Diet Recommendations

- Absolutely NO solids
- Soups: Clear Bouillon Broths such as beef, chicken, or vegetable broth.
- Beverages: Tea, Black Coffee (no creamer), Gatorade, Carbonated Soda, Apple Juice, Cranberry Juice,
 Orange Juice, Grape Juice, and/or Crystal Light for diabetic patients.
- Desserts: Jell-O, Popsicles, Ices
- Please avoid consuming drinks/products that are RED or BLUE.

Day of Your Procedure

You will need a driver to and from your procedure. The driver will be allowed to enter the facility with
you. Please inform the driver to stay within 30 minutes of the facility. Once you are starting the
discharge process a nurse will contact your driver.

- Leave all valuables at home.
- Go in comfortable clothing.
- Call our office to schedule a 2-3 week follow up.

Things to keep in mind...

- CHECK IN TIMES-Check in times are always tentative and subject to change. The schedule is always updating. The check in time given to you at the time of schedule could fluctuate significantly between now and your procedure date. Usually, the hospital or facility to where you are schedule will contact you a few days prior. Go with the time they give to you, the hospital/facility time trumps what we have discussed as they have the most up to date schedules and times.
- BENEFITS/COVERAGE-Our office will always contact your insurance plan to get a prior authorization if one is needed. If you are subject to a deductible or out of pocket the facility will contact you in regards to charges. We do not give quotes for the facility/hospital or anesthesia charges. They will collect on any charges at the latest 7 days prior to your procedure date.
- NO SHOWS-If you no show to your procedure you will be subject to a \$150.00 NO SHOW fee. You will not be rescheduled till fee is paid in full. The provider will need to see you in the office before another date is set. The fee must also be paid in full.
- RESCHEDULING-We understand life happens but rescheduling a surgical procedure can be difficult as there are many moving pieces. Please be mindful of rescheduling your procedure, to avoid any charges you should reach out to your scheduler within 1 week of your procedure to reschedule, otherwise you could be subject to a \$75.00 rescheduling fee. If patient NO SHOWS, please remember there will be a \$150.00 NO SHOW fee.
- FMLA/Short Term Paperwork-Our office charges a \$75.00 fee for any paperwork. This fee can be paid at the time of your surgery being scheduled, or upon completion our office will contact you for payment.
