

Major Colon Surgery
Please remember to read through all the pre-operative instructions. As it is pertinent to your upcoming procedure. If you should not follow the instructions, it could lead to your procedure being cancelled or rescheduled.
Our office will contact you one day prior to your procedure to remind and confirm. That phone call will go over check in time again, answer any questions, and schedule a three week follow up with your provider.
<u>Medications</u>
There are instances when your insurance carrier does not cover the medications we send, if you need purchase any of the items over the counter. Here is a list of what you would need to purchase.
□ Dulcolax Laxative Pills
☐ MiraLAX (238 gram) Bottle
<u>Antibiotics</u>
□ Levaquin 500mg Itab only (8am)
☐ Flagyl (Metronidazole) 500 mg 3 Tablets (8am/4pm/10pm)
Preparing for your Colon Surgery
<u>7 Days Prior</u>

• Patient's taking blood thinning medication should obtain directions from their prescribing physician when to stop and restart the medications.

- If you are required to obtain clearance for surgery, please be sure that our office has received your clearance at least one week prior to your surgery to avoid any delays or rescheduling,
- Stop all anti-inflammatory medications such as aspirin, ibuprofen, Advil, and Aleve. If you need anything 7 days prior, TYLENOL only

1 Day Prior

- The morning prior to your procedure, you will begin a clear liquid diet. This begins as soon as you wake up,
- You should be drinking plenty of fluids throughout the day to stay hydrated
- At 8am consume Levaquin (levofloxacin) 500mg Itab only and 1-500mg Flagyl (metronidazole) tablet
- At 3pm, consume 3 Dulcolax Laxative Pills.
- At 4pm consume 1-500mg tablet Flagyl (metronidazole)
- At 5pm, mix the whole bottle of MiraLAX (238grams/1 ¹/2 cups of MiraLAX powder) with a 640z of Gatorade/Powerade/Crystal Light for diabetic patients. Shake well and consume within one hour. The bottle must be completely empty.
- Continue drinking plenty of fluids to stay hydrated
- At 10pm, consume 1-500mg Flagyl (metronidazole) tablet.
- Nothing to eat or drink after midnight,

Clear Liquid Diet Recommendations

- Absolutely NO solids!
- Soups: Clear Bouillon Broths such as beef, chicken, or vegetable broth.
- Beverages: Tea, Black Coffee (no creamer), Gatorade, Carbonated Soda, Apple Juice, Cranberry Juice, Orange
 Juice, Grape Juice, Crystal Light. MAKE SURE THE BEVERAGES ARE NOT BLUE OR RED
- Desserts: Jell-O, Popsicles, Ices MAKE SURE THEY ARE NOT BLUE OR RED

Day of Your Procedure.

- You will need a driver to and from your procedure. The driver will not be allowed to enter the facility with you but can drop you off. For major surgery you will be admitted into the hospital for observation and care for 2-5 days. Once you are starting the discharge process a nurse will contact your driver to come pick you up by phone,
- Leave all valuables at home.
- Take a change of clothes, all toiletries that you may need,
- Phone and tablets are okay to take just remember they are your responsibility. Do not forget a charger,
- Take a current list of medications that you take.
- Call our office to schedule a 2 week follow up.

Things to keep in mind...

• CHECK IN TIMES-Check in times are always tentative and subject to change. The schedule is always updating. The check in time given to you at the time of schedule could fluctuate significantly between now and your

procedure date. Usually, the hospital or facility to where you are schedule will contact you a few days prior. Go with the time they give to you, the hospital/facility time trumps what we have discussed as they have the most up to date schedules and times. Our office will also call one day before to reconfirm with you.

- BENEFITS/COVERAGE-Our office will always contact your insurance plan to get a quote of benefits. If you are subject to a deductible or out of pocket our office will contact, you via telephone or email to discuss what your charges will be for our providers. We do not give quotes for the facility/hospital charges. We will collect on any charges at the latest 2 days prior to your procedure date.
- NO SHOWS-If you no show to your surgery you will be subject to a \$100 dollar no show fee. You will not be rescheduled. The provider will need to see you in the office before another date is set. The fee must also be paid in full.
- RESCHEDULING-We understand life happens but rescheduling a surgical procedure can be difficult as there are
 many moving pieces. Please be mindful of rescheduling your procedure, to avoid any charges you should reach
 out to your scheduler within 48 hours of your procedure to reschedule, otherwise you could be subject to a \$50dollar rescheduling fee.
- FEES-Our office is only responsible for quoting our own fees. Even then so, the estimate we provide is an estimate. If you are subject to deductible, coinsurance, or out of pocket we will contact to go over the amount with you. If you have a surgical copay, that will be collected 3 days prior to your procedure by the surgical coordinator.
- SURGICAL ASSIST-In most major colon surgeries your physician will require a surgical assist. The surgical assist is not always contracted with your insurance plan. If they are not, you will be sent a separate bill from the assist surgeon. Our office can provide you with the surgical assists' information should you have any questions or concerns.
- FMLA/Short Term Paperwork-Our office charges a \$75.00 fee for any paperwork. This fee can be paid at the time of your surgery being scheduled, or upon completion our office will contact you for payment.
- Please allow our office 7 business days to process paperwork.
